

# **CODE OF GOOD CONDUCT:** A GUIDE FOR SPECTATORS, PARENTS, GUARDIANS & CARERS Reviewed February 2025

At Reigate Priory Bowmen, it is the responsibility of all members to promote high standards of behaviour in archery. Spectators, parents/guardians and carers of Reigate Priory Bowmen archers share this responsibility too.

This code of conduct applies to spectators, parents/guardians and carers, as well as every Reigate Priory Bowmen archer when involved in the sport of archery, whether that be by supporting, watching or taking part. This code places emphasis on junior archers, but recognises that spectators, parents/guardians and carers are also present for senior archers in the sport.

## **Parental Responsibility**

The safety of junior archers is one that the Club shares with parents/guardians. Whilst our members will always put the welfare of children and young people first, the responsibility for the care, good behaviour and safe conduct of junior archers remains with their parent/guardian.

A parent or legal guardian must always accompany their children and young people to and from the Club and remain present. This means that parents/guardians must actively supervise their children and young people while at our grounds.

## **Expected minimum standard of behaviour**

Reigate Priory Bowmen must adhere to Archery GB's Code of Conduct (2023). As such, spectators, parents/guardians, and carers must:

## Respect the spirit of fair play in archery:

- Remember that archers take part because it's fun!
- Recognise effort as well as success
- Let coaches do their job, please refrain from confusing archers by telling them what you think they should do
- Promote good sportmanship by showing respect to fellow archers, Club Officers and officials safeguarding@reigatepriorybowmen.org.uk



# **Expected minimum standard of behavior**

## Respect the dignity, rights and worth of others:

- Respect fellow parents/guardians, spectators, carers, coaches, Club Officials and archers
- Respect decisions made by a Club Officer, coach, official and teach young people in your care to do the same
- Remember that everyone will make mistakes Nobody's perfect!
- Appreciate skill, effort and participation by archers and volunteers
- Show appreciation for Club volunteers please remember no one at Reigate Priory Bowmen is paid for their work towards the Club

## Strive to ensure the safety of myself and others:

- If participating in coaching, please let the coach know about any injuries that a young person may have
- Place the well-being, safety and enjoyment of archers, particularly juniors, above everything, especially standards of performance

## Protect others involved in archery from abusive, threatening or intimidating behaviour:

- Never scold or ridicule a child or young person for making mistakes or losing a competition
- Promote good sportsmanship by leading by example
- Adhere to the Club's Safeguarding Policy
